
Shades of Distributed

Single-site



everyone is co-located in the same physical location. Ideally this means you're all within a few steps of each other.

Multi-site



has two or more co-located groups at separate locations within a larger team, perhaps with some formal sub-team boundaries and responsibilities.



occur when you have most of the team co-located, but a few members working remotely, either from home or in another office.


Remote-first

everyone works in a separate location, usually from home, and thus all communication occurs online.

Remote versus Co-located Work


What makes innovation possible?

Rooms make invitations, shape behavior


